Slavs in Sports - a correction!

Was it an incomplete pass? A fumble? Whatever you call it, it was a blown play. In our article showcasing Slav players in the NFL, we overlooked a local gridiron standout from our own backyard:

Nick Papac (1935—2009), raised in the Del Rey area, son of Yugoslav immigrants Robert and Madeline Tomicich Papac, first played as a quarterback on the



football team at Sanger High School. Lovingly coached, encouraged, and cheered on by brother and sister, ASAA members Stella Wisniewski and the late Lou Papac, Nick went on to quarterback at Cal Berkeley and then completed his college football career at Fresno State, where he played quarterback for the Bulldogs. During a stint in the military, Nick played for the Army team at Fort Carson, Colorado. He then tried out for the Dallas Cowboys and the Oakland Raiders, eventually wearing #12 and playing QB for the Raiders,

alongside fellow Sanger grad Tom Flores, during the 1961 season.

Who do you think you are?

We continue our series of short biographies, in this issue looking back at the life and legacy of long-time member Vincent R. Dulcich (1918—2010):

Born on the island of Hvar in 1918, Vince (Visko Ratimir) Dulcic was the oldest of four siblings. With the hope of building a new life for his family, Vince's father, Nikola,

left Hvar and his young family in 1922 (when little Vince was only 4) to travel to San Pedro, California, determined to earn enough money to send for them soon. That dream was not easily realized, and in 1933, at the age of 15, young Vince also made the trip to San Pedro (via New York) to help his father work toward his dream of reuniting his family in America. First working in a cannery, Vince then found work on a fishing boat, and worked for the next ten years as a commercial fisherman.



In 1935 he made his first trip to visit relatives, the Subotich family, in Kerman. There he met Lucille Jerkovich, his cousin's girlfriend, and over time and after many visits to the valley, stole her heart. She played a little "hard to get", but eventually Vince and Lucille were married in Kerman in 1941. They made their first home in San Pedro, where Vince was still a fisherman. After daughter Nanci was born the young family moved to Kerman (1945) where Vince became a grape grower. Second daughter Judi was born, and over the years Vince became highly respected not only as a grower, but also as a jack-of-all-trades, especially skilled in the building trades ... so skilled, in fact, that he built his own home in 1965 and later made significant additions to his daughter Nanci's home.

It was in 1946 that Vince joined the ASAA, and he remained a member until his passing in 2010 at age 91—a total of 64 years! Vince and Lucille were blessed with two daughters, two grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. After many years as a grower in the Kerman area, Vince retired as a gentleman farmer, fisherman, coffee club member, storyteller, and loving grandfather and great-grandfather. He and Lucille enjoyed 45 years of marriage until her death in 1987.

As for Vince's mother and siblings on Hvar? Several attempts were made to bring them to the U.S., but there were several obstacles as well ... his mother contracting cancer, World War II, and his siblings starting families of their own. Sadly,

Due to his long involvement with ASAA and his service as a Board Member, Vince came to be in possession of the original charter for the association, signed by the California Secretary of State in 1905 (see p. 1 and 2). We are so grateful that he kept the document, and that his daughter Judi has made the document available to ASAA.

This charter document will be on display at our Summer Picnic in Fresno this coming August 7—make plans to join us, and thus honor the memory of Vincent R. Dulcich.

The Tom and Martha Slaven Scholarship Program

HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS AND COLLEGE STUDENTS WHO MAY APPLY:

- A. A child, grandchild, or great-grandchild of a present member in good standing for at least two full calendar years.
- B. A child, grandchild, or great-grandchild of a deceased member in good standing at the time of demise.
- C. AND who plan to attend a two year or four year accredited college or university.
- D. Applicants must demonstrate scholastic and extra-curricular achievements, civic accomplishments, and work history (if applicable). The selection committee of the ASAA shall evaluate these with an objective and academic view.

- A. Please mail completed applications to above address by June 3, 2016.

SELECTION COMMITTEE TIMELINE:

The highest scoring candidates, as scored by the members of the selection committee, will be notified by mail in July. The amounts of the grants for the 2016-2017 academic year will be determined at a later date. These funds will be sent to the successful candidates' colleges in July or August.
