


If you missed the festival this year, plan now to attend next year when we will meet in Fresno. It's great time for the whole family!

World Games!

The 5th **Hrvatske Svjetske Igre** Jubilee will be held in Zagreb, July 21-25, 2020. Young Croatian athletes from all over the world and all others who feel that way will have the opportunity to compete in various sports disciplines.

Athletics (track & field), bowling, basketball, volleyball, table tennis, handball, beach volleyball, football, swimming, judo, soccer, tennis and taekwondo are offered for both female and male competitors. Male participants were also offered rugby and water polo.

At the same time, a special category of competitors will be veterans, and the sports they can apply for are tennis and table tennis (male and female), and football (male only).

ASAA member Marc Hure saw the invitation (actually, it came by way of his sister) and said to his son Dominic, "Let's go for it!" So they are planning to do just that - "go



for it", and apply to be members of the Team USA contingent. They hope to travel to Croatia for the 2020 Croatian World Games, competing in the swimming competition. In addition to the many sports competitions, there will also be concerts and social celebrations, with the goal being to build and foster a bridge that permanently connects Croatian youth from their homeland and the world. Participants will be housed in the student housing at the University in Zagreb, and the Games are "open to anyone who has the smallest sense of love and belonging to the Croatian people in their hearts".

According to the Games website, some of the goals of the Games are: Strengthening national awareness and belonging, strengthening links between Croatian communities worldwide, promotion of Croatian tourism, providing incentive to return to the Homeland, making friends and business connections, reuniting with relatives, creating incentive for learning Croatian,




