For the first time, Croatian chocolate has won gold in a worldwide competition. **Nadalina**, an artisan chocolate shop in Split, has won gold for their milk chocolate "Cococa Coffee Nicaragua", crafted from perfectly blended and balanced cocoa and coffee beans. Marinko Biškić, founder of Nadalina, spent six months refining this recipe, and said, "this time I was convinced that the chocolate with Nicaraguan cocoa and coffee would win an award, but the gold sur-

"Travels with Danger!"

Over the last year, I have written about the incredible opportunity I had with the Slavic American Cultural Organization to travel to Croatia in the summer of 2022 as a Student Ambassador. One of the many benefits of that trip was visiting my grandfather's village and meeting family. This past summer, I was fortunate enough to return and experience so much more because of that wonderful opportunity last summer!

Mom and I flew into Split on a little Croatia Airlines propeller plane. We rented a car and drove to Split, where we stayed at Hotel Corner, the same hotel we stayed



in as students the year before. The next morning, before departing south, we visited Stadion Poljud, the home stadium of the infamous Hajduk Split team. Our timing was perfect because we were able to tour the stadium. If you are ever in Split, I highly recommend this tour because it includes so much history about not only the team but the region itself.

From Split, it was a straight shot south on the A1 to Saric Struga, the village where my grandfather, Ante, was born. The most poignant part of this trip was taking my mom to visit my grandfather's gravesite for the first time, which I had visited last year. My mom noted how guiet it was and how happy she was that he had such a peaceful final resting place. From the cemetery we descended to the village and walked the only narrow road, looking forward to seeing our family.

Word travels fast in those small villages, because within minutes of our arrival at the community center, we were greeted by a crowd with hugs, shots of rakija, and the wonderful smell of dinner. We stayed for several hours that night, cheering the Croatian national soccer team on for a come-from-behind win against the Netherlands. The

rest of our stay there was filled with visits to our distant cousin's bakery, daily morning coffee at the local cafe with family, and dinners of frog legs and eel, local delicacies, with cousins.



We were very lucky that a qualifying race for the Marathon Lada was happening the week we were visiting. The Marathon Lada is a boat race among various towns that was started in 1998. The boats are unique because they are very shallow and wide, like the boats used long ago for transport on the Neretva River. My Cont. next page cousin's husband was racing for Gusari Komin. There were big crowds, happy families greeting each other, children eating ice cream, and a very exciting race among ten teams. It was an awesome evening. My favorite part of this trip was visiting the neighboring village's elementary school. I have been corresponding with the students for a few years, sending them English language books for their program and lots of candy. To meet them and their teachers was a dream come true! They cheered with delight when I told them my favorite Hajduk player was Mar



ko Livaja. Funny enough, he is preferred to Bruno Petković, practically a local to Rogotin, who plays for the rival team, Dinamo Zagreb. We played corn hole on a portable set we had brought from the States and took lots of pictures. I promised to return next summer!
